The MBA concentration in Information Technology Management is designed to meet the emerging market demand for IT management professionals. Information is a key asset to any organization. The concentration seeks to develop IT management professionals who will lead an organization's strategies to most effectively define, store, manage, protect, share and distribute information to relevant stakeholders as well as exploiting the power of information technology to create a competitive advantage. Courses include coverage of data and database management; information systems design and development; and data communications, computer networks, and security.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS:

Admission to the MBA program is determined on the basis of demonstrated professionalism, intellectual capability for successful completion of the program and the potential for leadership. Students may be admitted and begin the MBA program during spring, summer or fall semester. Criteria for admission to the Lake Erie College Parker MBA Program:

- A bachelor's degree from an accredited four-year college or university
- Submission of official undergraduate transcripts and any graduate work completed (sent directly to Admissions from degree granting institution)
- Complete MBA application found at http://www.lec.edu/admissions/ graduate
- Submit current resume outlining work experience and education that has prepared the candidate to begin the MBA program
- A personal statement of up to 500 words (topics found online)
