

The Bowling Green State (BGSU) Master of Education in Special Education with a focus on assistive technology is designed to prepare teachers and other professionals to support students by using assistive technology. Access to assistive technology enables individuals with disabilities to participate more fully in their homes, schools and communities.

A certificate in assistive technology is embedded into the master's program or available as a stand-alone certificate.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS:

Applicants are required to submit scanned copies of official or unofficial transcripts from all institutions attended. Upon admission, final official or notarized copies of transcripts from all institutions where degrees were earned and diplomas from international institutions must be submitted. Also, applicants are asked to provide a statement of purpose. One of the following test scores is required for those applying for the Master of Education program that have not already earned a master's degree: Praxis scores, OAE scores or GRE scores (within the last five years). Those applying for the certificate program only do not have to provide test scores.

TUITION & FEES:

BGSU has competitive tuition for eCampus students in the program. Please refer to <https://www.bgsu.edu/bursar.html> for current tuition and fees. Not all fees in the tuition brochure apply.

REGISTRATION PROCEDURE:

Students request registration through the eCampus office after admission and acceptance to the program. BGSU eCampus students receive one-stop-shop services through the eCampus office, assisting them from application to graduation.

ACADEMIC CALENDAR:

Courses are offered in seven-week sessions throughout the year. Students can begin the program in August, October, January, March, May and June.

DELIVERY MODE:

The Master of Education and Certificate programs are offered 100 percent online.

TEXTBOOK PURCHASE:

Information available upon acceptance into the program.

TOTAL HOURS NEEDED:

Fifteen hours are required to complete the certificate which can be applied toward the 33 hours needed to complete the Master of Education program.

FINANCIAL AID INFO:

Financial Aid is available to eligible students. BGSU eCampus has an assigned financial advisor to assist students with their questions.
