The Lakeland Foundation promotes the foundation and the college within the community, increasing public awareness of the importance of supporting public education in Northeast Ohio. The Lakeland Foundation also serves as a strategic link between the college and the community, developing alliances to foster communications and collaborations.

# Annual Donor-Scholar Breakfast Celebrates Academic Success

Each spring, Foundation donors, scholarship recipients, and friends come together to celebrate the difference that our donors make in the daily lives of Lakeland students. The Lakeland Foundation manages approximately 180 scholarship funds that provided more than \$450,000 in scholarship awards to more than 500 students in the past year. In addition, the Foundation oversees a growing number of program restricted funds that help students succeed.

On April 17, 2013, approximately 150 guests listened to student scholarship recipients Ashley Adcock, Darnell Campbell, Cristina Chavez Lopez, and Ben Wotawa speak about how scholarships and Lakeland support systems have helped them meet the challenges of pursuing their academic goals and dreams. Among those challenges were transitioning from military service to college life, being a first generation student, being a single mother, balancing full-time employment with full-time coursework, feeling unprepared for college level work, and much more. Students spoke about the financial assistance they received, as well as the support from programs offered through the Men's and Women's Resource Centers, Veterans programs, and Hispanic programs. They talked about how those programs helped them address their personal and academic challenges – how that support is helping them achieve their goals.

Dede Storer, of the George B. Storer Foundation and Lakeland Foundation board member, spoke of her and her late husband's (Jim Storer) passion for supporting the academic goals of students. Mrs. Storer commented that she and her husband shared the belief that "education is the life changing experience for anyone" and that their goal was to see that anyone could have that experience.

Nancy Guthrie, Lakeland Foundation board chair, commented in her remarks, "I have to admit that of all I have done as chair, attending this event probably gives me the most pleasure. What could be better, after all, than to spend an hour with donors and volunteers who are passionate about making a difference here at Lakeland and with students who - despite the ups and downs of life - are doing so much to succeed at Lakeland?"

# Making a *Real Difference* in Student Success



On May 11, 2013, the Arlene and Arthur Holden University Center at Lakeland Community College recognized its first partnership graduates. Thirty-eight undergraduate students earned their bachelor's degrees from their four-year institutions and 48 students earned their master's degrees. Undergraduate students who participated in Lakeland's commencement ceremony received congratulatory Holden University Center certificates presented by Arlene Holden.

Three undergraduate students receiving their bachelor's degrees started their academic careers in Lakeland's SMART program (Single Mothers Achieving Real Triumph) through the Women's Center and benefitted from various scholarship awards and grants throughout their academic journey. In May, Gloria Lane, manager of Lakeland's Women's Center, wrote the following:

"As you know, this is the first year that students will be graduating with degrees from the Holden University Center. As you also know, students are given the option of walking in the graduation ceremony at the home institution or here at Lakeland. I have just learned that three students who have earned Cleveland State University degrees will be walking here on the morning of May 11. I am happy and proud to report that all three of these students are closely affiliated with the Women's Center and the SMART program. They are Maria Bennett, Nicole Candow and Vikki Williams.

**Maria Bennett** was a student worker in the Women's Center in the spring of 2006. This was the time that we were grappling with how to better assist single mothers in their quest for education and were in the process of creating the SMART program. As a single mother herself, Maria brought her own personal experiences to the table and was an integral part in the formation of this dynamic program. She worked with us for several more semesters, providing awesome support to those early members of the SMART program, until she graduated in the spring of 2008. Since then Maria has been working for Lakeland in the various incarnations of CBI/Workforce Development while she has been pursuing her bachelor's degree from Cleveland State University. Maria is an amazing example of how a single mother can overcome multiple obstacles that might otherwise get in her way, to become an educated woman and provide a better life for her family.

**Nicole Candow** was the first woman who was officially accepted into the SMART program. Nicole's enthusiasm and dedication has been

unending. From the fall of 2006 through the spring of 2013 – a total of seven academic years – Nicole plugged away at her educational goals. Nicole is an amazingly bright woman, and the mom of a special needs daughter. She is the sole provider and caregiver for her daughter, and had to juggle many difficult aspects of life throughout her years in college. She did it successfully! She credits the SMART program with helping her understand that she is not alone, that her story is not the worst, and that she CAN do it! And now she has!

**Vikki Williams** started college in the spring of 2007, and then joined the SMART program that fall. She did not enjoy her first semester on campus, and credits the SMART program with putting the "community" in community college. Vikki is the single mom of a son who was just an infant when she joined the program. As she gets her bachelor's degree this week, he is finishing up a year of kindergarten. As a kindergartener, he already states that he will go to college, something he has learned from his mom, since almost no one else in his family background has attended college. Vikki has always said that her son was her motivation, and she has been an amazing example to so many other women in the SMART program,

first as a co-participant, then as an alumnus, a student worker in the Women's Center, and currently as the program coordinator. She is now leading by example by getting her degree and showing other women that it can be done!

In the Women's Center, we are bursting at the seams with pride over the graduation of these women! Statistically, they are women who should never have earned their diplomas. They could check off "all" on any list of college risk factors: low income, having dependents, single

parent, financially independent, attending part time, delayed enrollment after high school, first generation college student, poor previous academic performance, and starting in developmental coursework in English and math. Yet, this weekend, they will be receiving diplomas for a bachelor's degree.

# Empowering Lakeland's Veterans

In spring 2013, the Lakeland Community College Board of Trustees approved naming rights for the **Wells Fargo Advisors, LLC Veterans Lounge** in recognition of their continuing support of programs that assist United States veterans in their academic endeavors and in the, often difficult, transition back to civilian life. Gifts from Wells Fargo, Aqua Ohio and other businesses and individuals support a dedicated lounge area for veterans, peer mentoring services, opportunities for Veterans Supporting Veterans officers to gain new knowledge regarding national trends and best practices, Veterans Day programming, graduation recognition, and more.

Lakeland's Veterans Supporting Veterans organization, a chapter of Student Veterans of America, was established by Ashley Adcock, Class of 2013, and Steve Oluić, Dean of Math, Natural & Social Sciences. Lakeland's veterans have credited this program with providing a needed safe zone for dealing with post-traumatic stress disorder (PTSD) and other challenges specifically related to returning veterans. In his remarks at the Donor-Scholar Breakfast, Ben Wotawa, vice president of Veterans Supporting Veterans, spoke of his personal experience with PTSD following his tour in Afghanistan saying, "Lakeland Community College saved my life."

For the fourth year, Lakeland has been designated as a Military Friendly School® by G.I. Jobs magazine. The list honors Lakeland as one of the top 20 percent of colleges, universities and trade schools, which do the most to embrace America's student veterans and ensure that they succeed on campus. Lakeland's inclusion on the 2013 list of Military Friendly Schools was based on criteria such as: class flexibility (evening, online and weekend); military-specific support services; and availability of veterans groups and networking.

# Lakeland's Founding President Honored

Inspired by Lakeland's founding president, Dr. Wayne L. Rodehorst, and his vision and passion for the arts, the Wayne L. Rodehorst Endowed Fund for Arts Scholarships was established to support students who wish to pursue an associate degree in the arts, are taking elective courses in the arts, or simply are taking classes in the arts for personal fulfillment.

"I was able, in my years at Lakeland, to see completed in bricks and mortar things I had only imagined," stated Rodehorst. "But more importantly, I was able to see people achieving – as a result of their education at Lakeland both inside and outside of the classroom – beyond what they ever thought possible. I can't imagine how dreary a life would be without the joys that a painting or great music can provide."

On May 19, 2013 following an outdoor ceremony and trumpet fanfare, Dr. Rodehorst and his wife unveiled a plaque dedicating the Dr. Wayne L. Rodehorst Performing Arts Center. While serving as Lakeland's first president from 1967 to 1981, Dr. Rodehorst directed construction of the college's performing arts area. To ensure quality acoustics, Dr. Rodehorst hired a top-notch architectural firm to design the auditorium and enlisted the help of some of the most respected acoustical experts in the country. Dr. Rodehorst was presented with a commemorative, framed photograph of the auditorium taken by Lakeland photography instructor Frank Prpic.



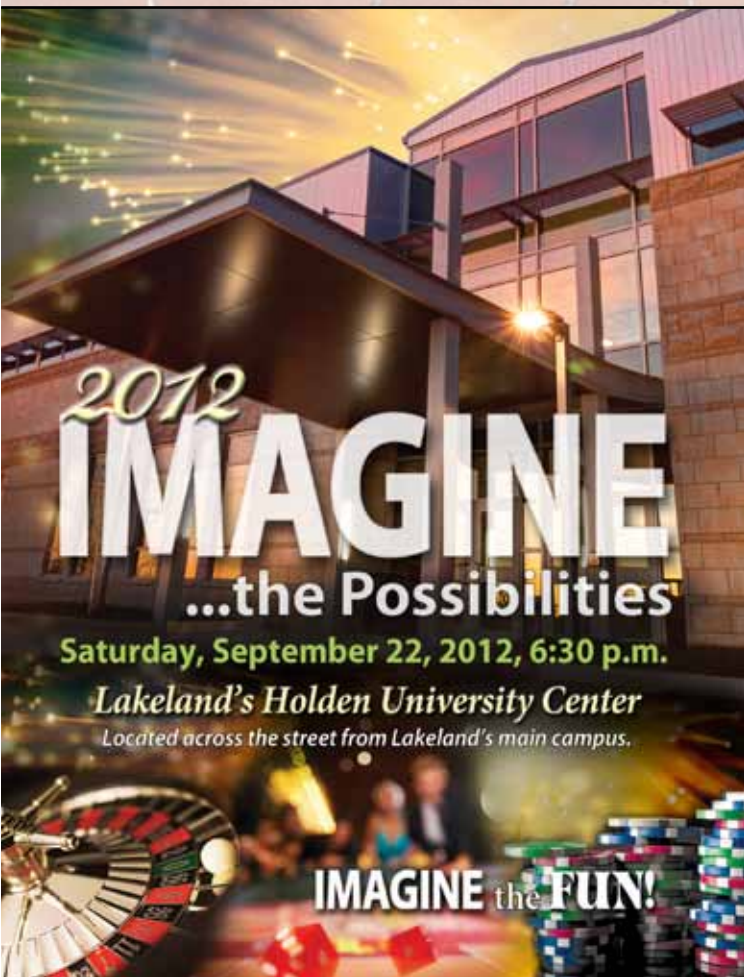

## "IMAGINE ... the Possibilities" – Award Winning Fundraising Event

The Lakeland Foundation's IMAGINE event, held on September 22, 2012, was named one of the top 10 fundraisers of 2012 by Cleveland area society magazine *Currents*. Also included in the top 10 were other notable organizations such as The Rock and Roll Hall of Fame and Museum, The Cleveland Orchestra, the Museum of Contemporary Art (MOCA Cleveland), and Cuyahoga Community College. IMAGINE... the Possibilities also received a district Silver Medallion award in two categories from the National Council for Marketing and Public Relations for its promotional and event design.

Proceeds from IMAGINE benefit Lakeland Foundation scholarships and programs. IMAGINE...the Possibilities was co-chaired by Lakeland trustee and Foundation board member, Kay Malec; faculty member and Foundation board member, Tina Barnauskas; and community leader, Ken Nicolai. The Las Vegas themed event was held at Lakeland's Holden University Center and showcased the facility's state-of-the-art technology. Lakeland's student ambassadors kept the Foundation's mission and IMAGINE's purpose top-of-mind for guests. Fine and graphic arts students added to the décor using classroom white glass to promote the evening's activities. Casino games, raffles, and food stations provided by Lakeland catering and several area restaurants and entertainment by Elvis and Frank Sinatra highlighted the evening for more than 300 guests.



# Ensuring the Future

Over the past two years, The Lakeland Foundation has seen a significant rise in the number of donors who have included Lakeland in their estate planning. These planned gifts total a current value of approximately \$4 million and will help to ensure that Lakeland students of the future will continue to receive scholarships, have access to state-of-the-art technology, and that the college can respond to the ever-changing needs of our students.

The Legacy Society of The Lakeland Foundation recognizes those who have made arrangements for Lakeland through planned gifts. In July 2012, Legacy Society members were entertained at a cocktail reception at Kirtland Country Club with Cleveland area historian, Dan Ruminski.

To date, 14 spaces have been named at Lakeland's Holden University Center, in addition to naming rights of the building itself, to recognize current and planned gifts from Lakeland Foundation donors to the Holden University Center Endowment Fund and the furtherance of the Holden University Center. Gifts to the Holden University Center Endowment Fund support scholarships, innovation in teaching, and state-of-the-art technology; approximately \$4 million has been raised to date.

In addition, The Lakeland Foundation and a group of key Lake County nonprofit organizations work together to inform our community about how each one of us can make a timeless difference in the lives of others. Leave a Legacy in Lake County is led by six Lake County nonprofit organizations including the Lake County Council on Aging, Lake County Historical Society, Lake-Geauga Fund of The Cleveland Foundation, The Holden Arboretum, Lake Health Foundation and The Lakeland Foundation, along with media partners, The News-Herald and WELW 1330 AM Radio.

Through entertaining and educational programs featuring the history of the Lake County (including "Bet Ya Didn't Know", "Marvelous Mansions", "Underground Railway", and "Remarkable Ladies"), Leave a Legacy underscores how past generations have left a legacy for future generations. Leave a Legacy fosters awareness that like so many others before us, everyone, no matter their wealth and no matter their personal passion, can make a difference to the future of the citizens and quality of life in Lake County through a planned legacy gift.

# Lakeland 2013 Alumni Hall of Fame Inductees Inspire Future Graduates

The Lakeland Alumni Hall of Fame was established in 2006 to recognize Lakeland alumni and their accomplishments. The Hall of Fame serves as a testimony to future Lakeland students. Nominations are open to the public and candidates are reviewed by the Hall of Fame committee. Nominees must have earned an associate degree or certificate from Lakeland Community College, have graduated at least 10 years prior to the nominating year, and demonstrate a strong record of community involvement and an ongoing commitment to Lakeland and to the values it represents. On August 1, 2013, in a ceremony held at Mooreland Mansion, the following Lakeland graduates were inducted into the Lakeland Alumni Hall of Fame.

**Morris Beverage III** graduated from Lakeland in 2000 with an Associate of Arts degree. He is employed as a financial advisor with Wells Fargo Advisors and has been integral in helping to establish Wells Fargo's support of Lakeland's Veterans programs and their support of Lakeland's Jazz Festival. Morris is on the boards of LEAF (Lake Educational Assistance Fund) and the Lake County Historical Society. He has been involved as a volunteer with The Lakeland Foundation Signature Events and is a regular attendee and supporter of many of our efforts.

**Tim DeWolf** graduated from Lakeland in 1987 with an associate degree in respiratory therapy. Tim worked as a respiratory therapist and then manager of the Cardiopulmonary Dept. of Defiance Hospital. Tim became disabled in 2001. He had been volunteering with Toys for Tots and assumed the coordinator position in 2002 until 2010. During that time, under his leadership, they increased the number of children receiving toys from a few hundred to more than 6,500; moved the toy sorting and distribution to Lakeland; increased revenue from a few thousand dollars to more than \$100,000; worked with SouthEast Harley Davidson who donated a motorcycle to raffle to generate income; created a website with electronic registration (hosted by Lakeland); and created partnerships with local agencies, including United Way, NAACP, and HOLA. Tim received Lakeland's Distinguished Service Award in April 2006. In 2008, following the suicide of a family friend related to a post-traumatic stress incident, Tim's daughter, Katie (also a Lakeland graduate), started a non-profit organization, The Ghost Rider Foundation (GRF). She went to grad school and enlisted in the Navy at which time Tim assumed the executive director position at GRF. The mission of GRF is to "bring them all the way home" by

helping veterans (and their families) who are in treatment for Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD) and all the challenges that process entails.

**Mary Ann Moyer** graduated from Lakeland with a certificate in business management in 1975 and an Associate of Arts degree in 1982. She holds a bachelor's degree in communications from Lake Erie College. Mary Ann worked for Lakeland as a publicist from 1979 -1981 and as the Director for Development and Executive Director of The Lakeland Foundation from 1994 until her retirement in 1997. She has been involved in a number of community and charitable causes including board president of the Mental Health Center, president of Lake County Professional Communicators, United Way, NSFRE (National Society of Fundraising Executives) board member, LAB (Learning About Business) board member, LEAF (Lake Educational Assistance Foundation) founding member, American Heart Association, the Leukemia Foundation, and Mentor Citizen of the Year. Mary Ann has lived in Florida for the past 15 years where she volunteers with the Care Bears program. Her granddaughter graduated from Lakeland's nursing program in May, 2013. She and her husband, Wimp, are members of The Lakeland Foundation Legacy Society and are Lakeland donors.

**Deborah Osgood** received her Associate of Arts degree in early childhood education in 1975. At that time, she was given the Outstanding Achievement in Child Development Award. Over the years, she took many continuing education courses primarily through Cleveland State University. She has more than 25 years' experience in nonprofit management, fundraising, program development and outreach; in 2010 she was awarded the Outstanding Fundraising Executive Award through the Association of

Fundraising Professionals, Greater Cleveland Chapter. She is currently vice president of development and marketing for the Achievement Centers for Children. Prior to 2004, she worked for Vocational Guidance Services and Heights Parent Center. She's an active volunteer – as a master gardener, as a founding board member of Faithful Reform which focuses on healthcare reform, as co-chair of the Outreach Committee of her church. Deborah has served as a guest presenter for several workshops conducted by the Lakeland Nonprofit and Public Service Center. She also serves on the Lakeland Alumni Strategic Planning Committee.

**Madeline (Madge) Ciofani** graduated from Lakeland in 1980 with an Associate of Applied Business degree in office management. Prior to her retirement, Madge was employed by the City of Willoughby Hills. She is a past president of the Lakeland Alumni Association and continues to actively serve the association. Madge also has served on the IMAGINE committee.

**Florine O'Ryan**, president of the Lakeland Alumni Association, received a special award for her years of service and commitment to the association. Florine has served as president of the Lakeland Alumni Association for more than 20 years and has served on the IMAGINE committee. She and her husband, Mort, established the Patty O'Ryan Frantz scholarship fund in memory of their daughter and are constant supporters of The Lakeland Foundation. Flo received the Women of Achievement Award in 1994. Prior to retirement, she was actively involved in the PTA, scouting, and the Willoughby Lions Club. She chaired the Willoughby Hills Recreation Committee from 1986 -1996, during which time her husband served as Mayor of Willoughby Hills.

# Lakeland Foundation Awards Innovation and Excellence in Teaching



Each year, The Lakeland Foundation, with the assistance of the Excellence in Teaching Committee, makes grant awards to faculty for innovative approaches to teaching and learning that enrich the educational experience and promote student success. In the spring of 2013, awards were made to support:

**“Best Practices: Promoting Student Success and Completion”** - Proposal by April Mason and Deb Shearer for a series of workshops for faculty that reinforced best teaching practices to motivate and engage students.

**“Teaching and Learning Effectiveness – Library”** - Proposal by Michelle Rossman for a series of faculty workshops that focused on the use of iPads in the classroom for interactive teaching and learning.

In addition, The Lakeland Foundation provides financial support for the annual **Excellence in Teaching Awards**. 2013 awardees included Hyojin Jeong, Ph.D., associate professor of economics; Gregory Truhan, assistant professor of criminal justice; Robyn Fry, instructor of business management; and Jennifer Teichman, instructor of psychology.

## Lakeland Alumni and Friends Network – Alumni Association Revitalized

Through the generosity of the Lubrizol Foundation, The Lakeland Foundation undertook a strategic planning process to energize the college’s alumni association. Lakeland has more than 25,000 alumni, most of whom still live or work in the area, and thousands of former non-graduating students. The strategic planning process gathered information through surveys and focus groups about how to best serve the needs of Lakeland alumni as well as those who took classes at Lakeland but did not graduate.

As a result, the Lakeland Alumni and Friends Network was created as a means of revitalizing the work of the alumni association and serving the needs of current Lakeland students, alumni and the community. The network brings together Lakeland graduates (defined as those who have earned associate degrees or certificates), former students who were enrolled in one or more courses, and community friends to enhance the academic success of Lakeland’s current students and to enhance the economic success of alumni and friends in our community.

The activities of the network are guided by an advisory group comprised of alumni, former non-graduating students, current students and community members. The initial work of the network will focus on outreach, networking and assisting current students.
