

### **BIOGRAPHIES**

LEONARD DICOSIMO is the president of the Cleveland Federation of Musicians, Local 4 and represents a diverse clientele of musical artists including the Musicians of The Cleveland Orchestra, Playhouse Square Foundation, independent songwriters and an abundance of world class musicians that call Northeast Ohio home. He is also the director of music ministry for Pilgrim UCC in Tremont. Prior to his Lakeland appointment, DiCosimo directed choirs, taught conducting classes and music directed productions for the music theater and theater departments for eight years of

DiCosimo played acoustic and electric bass for Playhouse Square Foundation, Great Lakes Theatre Festival and Cleveland Playhouse, served as a music director for productions at Cain Park in Cleveland Heights and worked with a variety of artists ranging from Phyllis Diller to the Fat Boys. He also sailed the high seas as a cruise ship musician. DiCosimo released two collections of origins songs and was owner of the incomparable wine and martini bar, Budapest Blonde, in Independence.



NADA VENCL MONTGOMERY has been the accompanist for the civic chorus since 1994 when former director, Romeo Pallante, brought her to the group. She has been a Lakeland Civic Band member since 1985 where she is the piccolo player and a soloist. For more than 20 years she has worked in the Independence Schools as accompanist for the high school under Ken Gunlicks, and currently, at the middle and high school under Gretchen Vencl Obrovac. She has also worked in the Mayfield and Orange schools, and has done some theater work.

Since 1974, her day job has been at Corlett Movers & Stg. Co., a family owned and operated business in Cleveland. Nada is a life member and the secretary of the Association of Concert Bands – an organization dedicated to adult community concert bands. She has been a trustee with Windjammers Unlimited, an organization that strives to preserve traditional music of the circus, and is a member of its Conductors' Committee.

Nada is also a life member and former instructor at Sokol Greater Cleveland – a gymnastic and educational organization of Czech origin. She is the mother of two grown daughters, Gretchen and Heidi, and is delighted to be a grandmother of two handsome little boys, Nolan and Kyle. She is married to Mike Montgomery, formerly of Naperville, IL, and they reside in Independence, OH and Bradenton, FL.

### **PROGRAM NOTES**

The American spiritual is a genre of folk music that gives expression to the suffering and the belief systems of African Americans during slavery and its aftermath. Hymns, work songs and field calls of this era were combined with African rhythms, instruments and vocal styles to develop this American music. It is one of the most significant forms of the American folk style.

Spirituals, like all folk music, was created by a community over a period of time and is best understood in the cultural context in which it was collectively created and performed. This genre was born of the exploitation of plantation slavery of the United States of America. The elements of Christianity are intermingled with numerous African religious beliefs in the lyrics of this music. The Old Testament, in particular Moses leading the Israelites out of slavery in Egypt, resonated with those ensnared in the slave experience.

Freedom songs based on spirituals have defined struggles for democracy in the United States and several countries around the world. Musical artists continue to draw upon the deep well of spirituals to create new protest songs during the twentieth century. The Civil Rights Movement of the 1950s and 1960s supported the efforts of civil rights activits in this country and at the end of last century in the former Soviet Union, eastern European countries and South Africa.


