

The Bowling Green State University (BGSU) Master of Education in Curriculum and Teaching program reflects teaching and learning in the 21st century and is based on the National Board for Professional Teaching Standards and the Ohio Standards for the Teaching Profession. This is a rigorous program that allows for deep reflection on your teaching and learning practices. As a candidate, you will expand your knowledge and leadership abilities in areas such as curriculum theory and design; current issues and trends in education; how to implement best practices and technology into your everyday teaching.

The program is flexible embedding 12 elective hours into the program. Students can choose between endorsements, certificates or other tailored courses.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS:

Applicants are required to submit scanned copies of official or unofficial transcripts from all institutions attended. Upon admission, final official or notarized copies of transcripts from all institutions where degrees were earned and diplomas from international institutions must be submitted. One of the following test scores is required for those applying for the Master of Education program that have not already earned a master's degree: Praxis scores, OAE scores or GRE scores (within the last five years).

TUITION & FEES:

BGSU has competitive tuition for eCampus students in the program. Please refer to <https://www.bgsu.edu/bursar.html> for current tuition and fees. Not all fees in the tuition brochure apply.

REGISTRATION PROCEDURE:

Students request registration through the eCampus office after admission and acceptance to the program. BGSU eCampus students receive one-stop-shop services through the eCampus office, assisting them from application to graduation.

ACADEMIC CALENDAR:

Courses are offered in seven-week sessions throughout the year. Students can begin the program in August, October, January, March, May and June.

DELIVERY MODE:

This Master of Education program and the endorsement courses are 100 percent online.

TEXTBOOK PURCHASE:

TOTAL HOURS NEEDED:

Twelve hours of electives can be used to complete a certificate which can be applied toward the 33 hours needed to complete the Master of Education program.
