The student who completes the college preparatory curriculum in the high school shall meet at least seven out of the eight criteria:
$\qquad$ 1. Earn four units of English.
$\qquad$ 2. Earn at least four units of Mathematics including Algebra I, Algebra II, Geometry and another higher level course, or a four-year sequence of courses that contains equivalent content.
$\qquad$ 3. Earn at least four units of Science including one unit of physics and one unit of chemistry.
$\qquad$ 4. Earn four units of Social Studies, including American History and Government.
$\qquad$ 5. Earn either three units of World Languages (must include no less than two units for which credit is sought; i.e., three units of one world language or two units each of two different languages.
$\qquad$ 6. Earn one unit of Fine Arts.
7. Maintain an overall high school grade point average of at least 3.5 on a 4.0 scale through seven semesters of high school.
8. Obtain a composite score of 27 on the ACT test or an equivalent combined score of 1210 on the SAT I, verbal and mathematics sections (excluding scores from the writing section.) This maintains the two scores' comparability as qualifying criteria.
