STUDENT HEALTH POLICIES FOR THE  
**HIMT PROGRAM**

For admission into the HIMT Program within the Division of Science & Health and continuation in the program, you must show evidence of good physical and mental health. The following requirements have been established to protect you against undue risk to your personal health, as well to protect the clients with whom you have contact.

Students who do not have the appropriate criteria complete by the first day of class (BEFORE THE START OF 3<sup>RD</sup> SEMESTER) may not attend clinical, resulting in a withdrawal from the course.

1. You must complete and sign the front page of the Health Record form.
2. You must have a physical exam, not more than 12 months prior to the start of clinicals; and submit it to Health Services 2 months prior to starting clinicals.
3. **Tuberculin Test (PPD)** -A two step TB test **or** a QuantiFERON gold blood test is required 3 months prior to starting clinicals. Please note: Mantoux test results can not be self-read, but must be read by a health official within 48-72 hours. An official document listing date of administration and date of results must be submitted to the Health Services Department, in S 011, for every Mantoux test completed and a copy of the lab results for the blood test. Average cost of the 2step TB is \$12 and the blood test is \$89, the cost will vary by provider.

**QuantiFERON gold blood test** - Required within six months prior to starting clinicals for students who are known **positive reactors**.

4. Proof of medical insurance must be submitted 3 months prior to the start of clinicals.

**Additional Requirements:** You will receive information on required Background Check and drug screening at your program orientation. There are specific companies and procedures required by clinical sites, **do not** have these done until you receive the information from Lakeland to do so.
